SRD DANGEROUS DOG DECLARATION [FILE NO. SD1546] SF. 3 YEAR OLD BRINDLE COLOURED MASTIFF TYPE DOG [MADDIE]

Dear [REDACTED]

As you are aware, on Saturday, October 14, 2023, at approximately 15:19 hours, your dog MADDIE, was involved in an aggressive dog incident at or near the 3900 block of Wavecrest Road, Campbell River, British Columbia [RCMP File No. 23-14901]. At the above date and time, and while a person was walking their leashed dog along the public roadway, MADDIE, and a German Shepherd owned by an immediate family member of yours, became at large, after aggressively charging onto the roadway from [REDACTED] and without provocation, attacked the dog.

The person held their dog by its collar in attempting to protect it, and although able to kick the German Shepherd off their dog, MADDIE continued attacking and biting, and grabbed the leashed dog by its neck, while biting down on the person's hand. Despite the person screaming for help, MADDIE did not release her grip while mauling and trying to drag the dog and its owner. A nearby resident heard the screams and intervened by hitting MADDIE over the head multiple times with a tool until she let go.

MADDIE inflicted a level 4 dog bite injury to the victim dog, of (4) canine puncture wounds, deep open lacerations, and considerable bruising, which required immediate emergency veterinarian surgery at the Central Island Veterinary Emergency Hospital in Nanaimo. Treatment included, sedation, the implantation of drainage tubes, anti-inflammatory medication, suturing, and prescribed pain medication and antibiotics. Further veterinarian treatment is expected.

The dog's owner also sustained serious dog bite injuries and was treated at the Campbell River North Island General Hospital, where they received thirteen (13) stitches to their hand and were prescribed pain medication and antibiotics. This was a very frightening ordeal, and had a neighbour not intervened, the outcome may have been far worse.

As numerous people, including seniors and children, use this public roadway on a daily basis, and as many dog bite injuries to people occur as a result of a person attempting to intervene and save their dog from an attack, this incident represents a significant public safety hazard and liability concern. As you are now aware that MADDIE has a tendency, or disposition for aggression, MADDIE's exposure to the public must be mitigated, and you may be held civilly liable in BC Provincial Court for third-party personal injury, and property damage claims as a result of MADDIE's actions. Extreme caution must be exercised in MADDIE's further care and control.

Due to this unprovoked attack in a public place, and the serious dog bite injuries inflicted, to both a person, and a domestic animal, this letter is to advise you that under Section 707.1 of the Local Government Act, and Section 49 of the Community Charter, MADDIE is considered a Dangerous Dog in the entirety of British Columbia.

MADDIE IS CONSIDERED A DANGEROUS DOG IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

As this incident is now learned behaviour, and as dogs can become habituated through repeated actions, displays of aggression can escalate in severity and can lead to further attacks and serious dog bite injuries. Once a dog has shown aggression, its movements must be restricted for the safety of all within the community, as aggression cannot be erased from a dog but can be controlled through proper handling and containment.

[Please note the following legislation]

COMMUNITY CHARTER [SBC 2003] CHAPTER 26

DANGEROUS DOG MEANS ANY DOG THAT

- a) has killed or seriously injured a person;




SRD DANGEROUS DOG DECLARATION [FILE NO. SD1546] NM. 2-YEAR-OLD BLACK/BROWN COLOURED SHEPHERD TYPE DOG [CREED]

Dear [REDACTED]

As you are aware, on Saturday, October 14, 2023, at approximately 15:19 hours, your dog CREED, was involved in an aggressive dog incident at or near the 3900 block of Wavecrest Road, Campbell River, British Columbia [RCMP File No. 23-14901]. At the above date and time, and while a person was walking their leashed dog along the roadway, CREED, and a Mastiff type dog owned by an immediate family member of yours, became at large, after aggressively charging onto the public roadway from [REDACTED] and without provocation, attacked the dog.

CREED reached the dog first, biting it near its rear quarters, and although the victim dog's owner was able to kick CREED off their dog, CREED inflicted a level 3 dog bite injury of one (1) canine puncture wound and extensive bruising to the dog's right ventral abdomen. As additional, and significant dog bite injuries were inflicted by the Mastiff type dog during the attack, immediate emergency veterinarian surgery was performed at the Central Island Veterinary Emergency Hospital in Nanaimo, with treatment including, sedation, the implantation of drainage tubes, anti-inflammatory medication, suturing, and prescribed pain medication and antibiotics. Further veterinarian treatment is expected.

The dog's owner also sustained serious dog bite injuries in relation to the Mastiff type dog and was treated at the Campbell River North Island General Hospital, where they received thirteen (13) stitches to their hand and were prescribed pain medication and antibiotics. This was a very frightening ordeal, and had a neighbour not intervened, the outcome may have been far worse.

As numerous people, including seniors and children, use this public roadway on a daily basis, and as many dog bite injuries to people occur as a result of a person attempting to intervene and save their dog from an attack, this incident represents a significant public safety hazard and liability concern. As you are now aware that CREED has a tendency, or disposition for aggression, CREED's exposure to the public must be mitigated, and you may be held civilly liable in BC Provincial Court for third-party personal injury, and property damage claims as a result of CREED's actions. Extreme caution must be exercised in CREED's further care and control.

As this incident is now learned behaviour, and as dogs can become habituated through repeated actions, displays of aggression can escalate in severity and can lead to further attacks and serious dog bite injuries. Once a dog has shown aggression, its movements must be restricted for the safety of all within the community, as aggression cannot be erased from a dog but can be controlled through proper handling and containment.

Due to this unprovoked attack in a public place, and the serious dog bite injuries inflicted, this letter is to advise you that under Section 707.1 of the Local Government Act, and Section 49 of the Community Charter, CREED is considered a Dangerous Dog in the entirety of British Columbia.

CREED IS CONSIDERED A DANGEROUS DOG IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

[Please note the following legislation]

COMMUNITY CHARTER [SBC 2003] CHAPTER 26

DANGEROUS DOG MEANS ANY DOG THAT

- a) has killed or seriously injured a person;
- b) has killed or seriously injured a domestic animal while in a public place or while on private property, other than property owned or occupied by the person responsible for the dog; or
- c) an animal control officer has reasonable grounds to believe is likely to kill or seriously injure a person.

BY-LAW NO. 1073

**A By-law of the Regional District of Comox-Strathcona
to provide for the impounding and control of animals
and for the licencing thereof, within
Electoral Areas "D", "E", and "F".**

WHEREAS the Regional District of Comox-Strathcona has been authorized to provide "Animal Control" within Electoral Areas "D", "E" and "F" being the participating municipalities;

AND WHEREAS within the participating member municipalities, the Regional District is authorized to exercise the powers contained in Clause (a) of Section 524, and Section 525, Subsection (s) of Section 932 and Subsections (2) and (4) of Section 933 and Section 934 of the Municipal Act, and those powers which are granted under the Livestock Protection Act, R.S.B.C., 1979, Chapter 245;

THEREFORE, the Regional Board of the Regional District of Comox-Strathcona in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

1. This by-law may be cited for all purposes as **"REGIONAL DISTRICT ANIMAL CONTROL BY-LAW NO. 1073"**.

INTERPRETATION

2. In this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires:

"Animal"	means any dog or domestic animal
"Board"	means the Regional Board of the Regional District of Comox-Strathcona
"Collector"	means the Collector of the District of Campbell River
"Council"	means the Council of the District of Campbell River
"District"	means Electoral Areas "D", "E", and "F" of the Regional District of Comox-Strathcona
"Domestic Animal"	means any horse, mule, ass, swine, sheep, goat, rabbit, animal of the bovine species, turkey, goose, duck, fowl, dove, pigeon, fur-bearing animal under the Fur-Farm Act, R.S.B.C. 1979, Chapter 148, and any wild animal so tamed as to be considered a pet by the owner thereof.
"Dog"	means any animal of the canine species, irrespective of age or sex
"Pound"	means any facility established, maintained, or operated as a pound in accordance with this by-law

- "Poundkeeper" means the person appointed from time to time by resolution of the council of the District of Campbell River for the purpose of enforcing and carrying out the provisions of this by-law, and includes any assistant poundkeeper appointed pursuant to the provisions of this by-law
- "Regional District" means the Regional District of Comox-Strathcona
- "Run at Large or Running at Large" means being elsewhere than on the premises of a person owning or having the custody, care or control of any animal and not being under the direct and continuous charge of a person who is competent to control it.
- "Treasurer" means the Treasurer of the District of Campbell River
- "Unlicenced Dog" means any dog for which the licence for the current year has not been paid as provided in this by-law or to which the tag provided for by this by-law is not attached.

ADMINISTRATION

3. The Board may, by resolution, enter into an agreement with the District of Campbell River or with any other person or organization for the establishment, maintenance, operation and regulation of a pound and for carrying out the various provisions of this by-law.
4. The Council may, by resolution, enter into an agreement with the British Columbia Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (hereinafter called the S.P.C.A.) or with any other person or organization for the establishment, maintenance, operation and regulation of a pound.
5. The Council shall, by resolution, appoint a Poundkeeper and such assistant or assistants as it may determine.
6. The Poundkeeper shall keep a poundbook in a form prescribed by the Treasurer from time to time, showing therein every animal impounded, the length of time of such impoundment, and all funds received and disbursed in respect of the operation of the pound.
7. The Poundkeeper shall report on the operation and maintenance of any pound in his charge to Council or to any person or committee designated by Council, at such times as Council may direct.
8. Every Poundkeeper shall keep the pound to which he is appointed, clean and in good repair and shall supply the animals impounded therein with sufficient and wholesome food and water and with reasonable shelter, segregation and care, as circumstances may warrant.
9. The Poundkeeper shall pay to the Treasurer, all funds received by him pursuant to the authority of this By-law forthwith after receipt thereof and all such funds shall become the property of the District.

LICENCING

10. 1. No person shall keep any dog unless a valid and subsisting licence has been issued in respect of that dog under this by-law.
2. An application for a licence under this by-law shall be made by paying the fee prescribed in Schedule "B" attached hereto and forming part of this by-law, and applying to the Collector in such form as the Collector may from time to time prescribe.
3. Upon receipt of the prescribed fee and a completed application form signed by the owner of the dog, the Collector shall issue a licence and corresponding licence tag for the dog.
4. A new resident of the Regional District who holds a valid and subsisting dog licence from another Municipality or Regional District shall be given credit for said licence by making application for a replacement licence and payment of the fee prescribed in Schedule "B".
5. Upon receipt of proof that a dog has been neutered or has received an ovario-hysterectomy, the Collector shall pay to the owner, the difference between the licence fee in Section 2 and Section 1 in Schedule "B" provided, however, no refund will be considered unless application for same has been received prior to the animal reaching the age of 11 months.
6. Where, in the opinion of the Poundkeeper, an animal having been adopted, proves to be unsuitable, the owner may return the animal and receive a refund of 75% of the fees paid to the District.
7. Notwithstanding the above, the owner of a dog adopted from the Campbell River Animal Shelter after January 1, 1989, shall pay the licence fee set out in Schedule "B", Section 1, as if the dog has been neutered or has received an ovario-hysterectomy. If the owner fails to have the dog altered prior to the age of 11 months, the licence fee shall revert to that set out in Schedule "B", Section 2.
8. Notwithstanding Section 9 hereof, the Poundkeeper is hereby authorized to retain the difference between the unaltered and altered adoption fees included in Schedule "A", Section 6. The Poundkeeper shall be accountable monthly to the Treasurer for the funds collected under this Section.
11. 1. Every licence and corresponding licence tag issued under this by-law:
 - a) expires on the 31st day of December of the year in which it is issued; and
 - b) is valid only in respect of the dog for which it is issued.
2. The person to whom a licence is issued under this by-law shall, while the licence is valid and subsisting, affix and keep affixed the corresponding licence tag to a collar or harness worn at all times by the dog for which the licence is issued.

3. Where a licence or licence tag is lost or destroyed, the person to whom the original licence was issued may, by paying the fee prescribed in Schedule "B", apply to the Collector, in a form and manner prescribed by him, for a replacement licence or licence tag.
 4. No person other than the owner of the dog shall remove from such dog a licence tag issued pursuant to this by-law, or a collar or harness to which a licence tag issued pursuant to this by-law is attached.
12. Where a dog has not been licenced for any calendar year:
- a) by the 28th day of February of that year; or
 - b) within one month of its acquisition by its owner; whichever date is the later, the fee for a dog licence shall be as prescribed in Schedule "B" to this By-law. Where a dog has been licenced before the later date as above, a five dollar (\$5.00) early payment discount shall be permitted.

ANIMAL CONTROL

13. No person owning or having the custody, care or control of any animal shall suffer, permit or allow such animal to run at large within the District.
14. No person owning or having the custody, care or control of any dog shall suffer, permit or allow such dog to be in a street, lane, park, or other public place within the District, unless such dog is led on a leash or chain by a person who is competent to control it.
- 14a. For a person contravening Section 14 of this By-law, an infraction may be laid and a summons issued by means of a ticket in accordance with the procedure set out in Section 14(2) to (9) of the Offence Act (1979), R.S.B.C., Chapter 305.
15. No person shall keep, harbour, house or maintain within the District any habitually noisy dog and no person owning or having the custody, care or control of a vicious dog shall suffer, permit or allow it to be upon any street, lane, park or other public place within the District unless such dog is muzzled and led on a leash or chain by some person over the age of 15 years.
16.
 - a) The Board may designate all or any part of a park or parks or a public place or public places as an area in which no animals shall be permitted and such an area or areas may be marked by signs or other devices.
 - b) No person owning or having the custody, care or control of any animal shall suffer, permit or allow such animal to be in an area designated pursuant to Subsection (a).
17.
 - a) The Poundkeeper or any peace officer may immediately seize and impound:
 - i) any animal that is found in any place contrary to the provisions of Sections 13 to 17 inclusive; or
 - ii) any unlicensed dog.

- b) If any peace officer seizes an animal pursuant to Section 17, he shall as soon as practical notify the Poundkeeper of such seizure and cause such animal to be delivered to the Poundkeeper.
 - c) The Poundkeeper shall receive and impound any animal delivered to him by a peace officer pursuant to Subsection (b).
 - d) The Poundkeeper shall retain in a pound, any animal seized and impounded pursuant to this Section and shall not release any such animal except in accordance with the provisions of this by-law.
18. Where a dog is seized and impounded pursuant to Section 12, the Poundkeeper shall:
- a) if the dog is unlicensed retain it for twenty-four (24) hours; or
 - b) if the dog is licensed, forthwith notify the owner thereof in person, by telephone or by mail addressed to the last known address of the owner in which case the notice shall be deemed to have been received by the owner twenty-four (24) hours after deposit thereof in any post box within the District, giving the following information:
 - i) date and time of impoundment;
 - ii) description of dog;
 - iii) name and address of the Poundkeeper to whom application may be made for release of the dog; and
 - iv) costs of seizure, expenses to the date of the notice and any continuing costs and expenses.
19. Where an animal other than a dog is seized and impounded pursuant to Section 17, the Poundkeeper shall, if the owner is known to the Poundkeeper, forthwith notify the owner in accordance with the provisions of Subsection (b) of Section 18.
20. a) If the owner or duly authorized agent of an impounded dog does not:
- i) in the case of an unlicensed dog within twenty-four (24) hours of impounding; or
 - ii) in the case of a licensed dog within forty-eight (48) hours of being notified pursuant to Subsection b) of Section 18
- appear at the Pound and release the dog so impounded by payment of the fees and charges set out in Schedule "A" attached hereto and forming part of this by-law, plus the cost of a licence for the dog, if applicable, the Poundkeeper may dispose of such dog as hereinafter set out.
- b) If the owner or duly authorized agent of an impounded animal does within forty-eight (48) hours of being notified pursuant to Section 19 or within seventy-two (72) hours of impounding, whichever comes first, appear at the pound and release the animal so impounded by payment of the fees and charges set out in Schedule "A", plus the cost of a licence for the animal, if applicable, the Poundkeeper may dispose of such animal as hereinafter set out.

- c) After the expiration of the relevant period of time set out in Subsections (a) and (b), the Poundkeeper may cause the animal to be sold by auction or private sale for an amount not less than the amount of any fees and charges outstanding plus the cost of a licence for the animal, if applicable, or if in the Poundkeeper's opinion the animal cannot or should not be sold he may destroy the animal.
 - d) Where any animal is sold pursuant to subsection (c) all property therein shall pass to the purchaser and all rights of property in the animal that existed before the sale shall be extinguished.
21. Notwithstanding any other provision of this by-law if it is found that any impounded animal is suffering from any injury, disease or sickness, or from any other cause or is unduly vicious, the Poundkeeper may, in his discretion, immediately destroy such animal if he is of the opinion that such animal would not survive such injury, disease or sickness, or that such animal constitutes a hazard or that it would be an act of humanity to destroy such animal.
22. It shall be the duty of the Poundkeeper to remove the carcass of any dog killed on a public street in the District whenever the killing of such animal on such street comes to his knowledge, and for so doing he shall be entitled to demand and receive from the owner or possessor thereof (if known) the fee set out in Schedule "A".
23. a) The Poundkeeper may, where he has reason to believe that an unlicensed dog has taken refuge on any premises, request the occupant of such premises to satisfy him that such licence has been paid and to exhibit such tag, or to forthwith deliver to him such dog. And where any dog is found to be on any such premises as aforesaid, no person shall fail or refuse to exhibit such licence receipt or tag, or fail, neglect, or refuse to deliver such dog on request, or resist or interfere with such Poundkeeper in seizing such dog.
- b) The Poundkeeper may, where he has reason to believe that an unlicensed dog has taken refuge on any premises that he has reason to believe are not occupied, enter such premises in order to seize such dog.
24. No person shall obstruct or interfere with the Poundkeeper or any peace officer in the exercise of any of the powers granted to or duties imposed on them pursuant to this by-law.
25. No person shall rescue or attempt to rescue any animal lawfully in the custody of the Poundkeeper or of any other person as herein provided, or in a pound.

VIOLATION OF BY-LAW

26. 1. Every person who violates any of the provisions of this by-law or who suffers or permits any act or thing to be done in contravention or in violation of any of the provisions of this by-law, or who neglects to do or refrains from doing anything required to be done by any of the provisions of this by-law, or who does any act which violates any of the provisions of this by-law, shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence against this by-law and liable to the penalties hereby imposed.

2. Every person who commits an offence against this by-law is liable upon summary conviction to a fine of not more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) and not less than Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00).
3. Every person who commits an offence of a continuing nature against this by-law is liable to a fine not exceeding Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each day such an offence is continued.

27. The following by-laws are hereby repealed:

By-law No. 1, 1982"
- By-law No. 660 being "Regional District Animal Control By-law No. 448, Amendment

By-law No. 3, 1984"

28. This by-law shall come into force and take effect on and after the date of final passing hereof.



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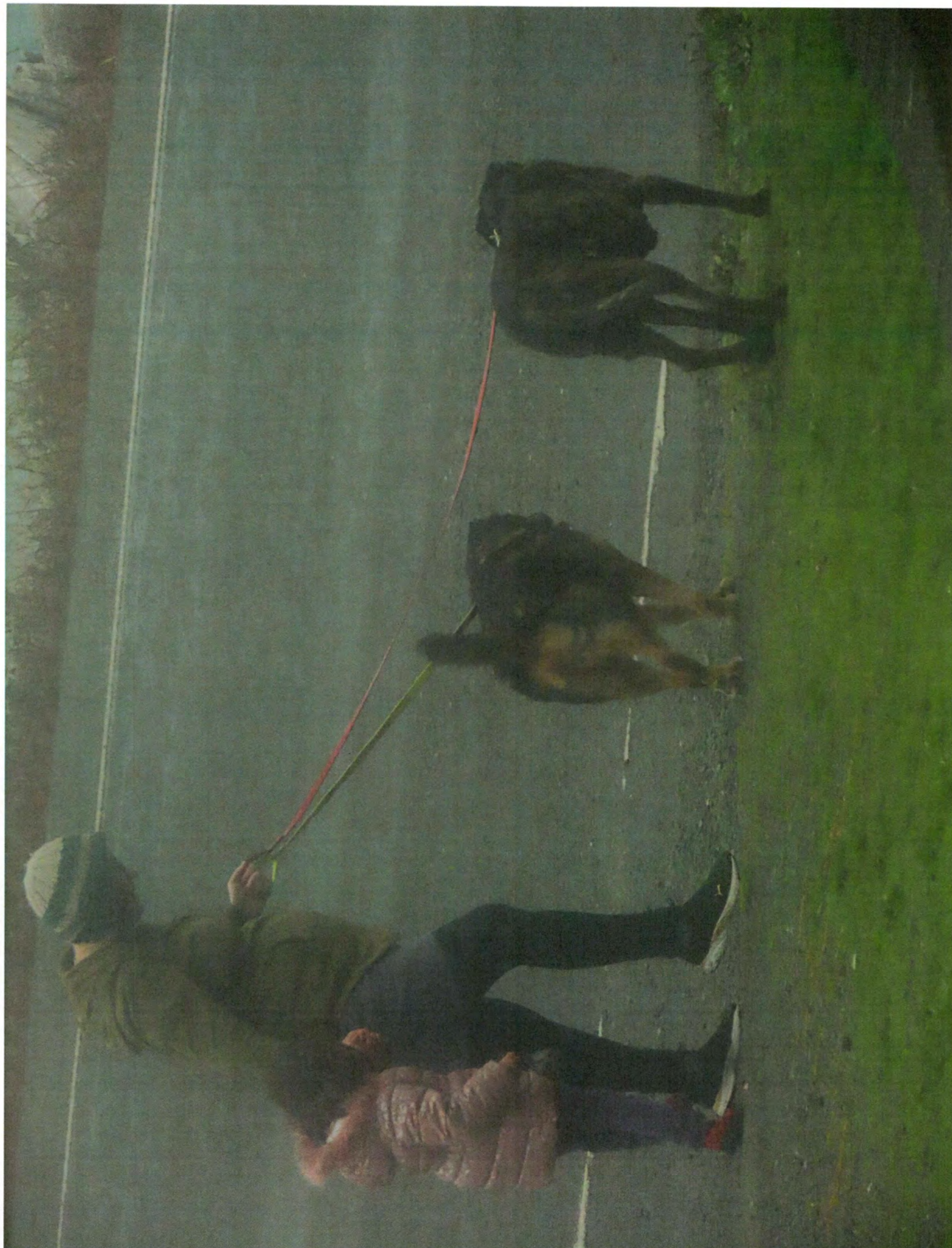

Thank you for your email. It is unfortunate that you did not want to speak with Senior ACO P. Toseland and the SRD Bylaw Enforcement Officer the other day concerning our investigation when they visited your home to provide you with information. We take public safety very seriously and the intention of their visit was to apprise you of the steps taken to ensure your safety, and that of the public is being addressed. As we must comply with the Privacy Act, we are not permitted by law to disclose personal third-party information, which includes the location of the dog residing in Area D, but through a Freedom of Information request made to the Strathcona Regional District, you will be provided the contents of our investigative file, with personal information redacted.

I can assure you we have thoroughly investigated this dog attack and have invested considerable effort to ensure the parties involved have been made aware of their legal obligations pursuant to the local Area D Bylaw, and Community Charter, and have been made aware of potential enforcement action if they fail to comply with applicable legislation. This may include punitive fines, and/or the dog(s) being seized with an application to the Provincial Court that the dog(s) be destroyed.

Both dogs involved in this attack have been formerly declared as Dangerous Dogs in British Columbia under Section 49 of the Community Charter, which is a province-wide designation, and which stays with the dog for the remainder of its natural life. Additionally, the highest punitive fines permitted under the Strathcona Regional District Bylaw have been issued.

Restrictions imposed on the dog residing in Area D relate to mandatory muzzling and are regulated under

the Strathcona Regional District Bylaw No. 1073, which states:

- a) - No person owning or having the custody, care or control of a vicious dog shall suffer, permit or allow it to be upon any street, lane, park or other public place within the District unless such dog is muzzled and led on a leash or chain by some person over the age of 15 years.
- b) The fine for violating the above section is \$150.00.

Under Section (284) of the Local Government Act, and Section (16) of the Community Charter, an Animal Control Officer, Bylaw Enforcement Officer, or Peace Officer, may enter at all reasonable times, upon any property subject to the regulations of these bylaws in order to ascertain whether such regulations or directions are being obeyed, but no authority is granted under this Bylaw to ensure a secure enclosure exists outside of a dwelling.

As Animal Control is proactive in establishing preventative measures to ensure public safety, Officers are making arrangements to attend the Mastiff owner's property to conduct a fence inspection to ensure their fence is structurally sound and able to contain the dog. The dog's owner has been receptive to making any changes Animal Control feels is necessary to ensure their dog can never escape. The German Shepherd, however, lives in another city, and its Dangerous Dog declaration is regulated by the Animal Control Bylaws of that jurisdiction, which may include mandatory containment provisions in addition to muzzling requirements and punitive fines for non-compliance.

As a stakeholder in promoting public safety, Animal Control, in partnership with the City of Campbell River, has been successful in amending the city's Animal Control Bylaw to include higher punitive fines for Vicious/Dangerous Dog violations, and have initiated discussions with the SRD Bylaw Department to similarly amend the Area D Animal Control Bylaw in concordance with that of the city. Animal Control is working very hard to ensure public safety is being maintained, and we encourage members of the public to inform us of potential hazards concerning aggressive dogs.

Hi Paul, Here are my notes from this morning as well as the call to the Crisis Nurse via VIHA. I hope that they are able to check in on her soon.

Paul Toseland (Animal Control Officer and Supervisor) along with myself drove to Billy Harlows (Billie) place of residence at [REDACTED] (beautiful clear weather, within Coastal Animal Control Vehicle) and arrived at approximately 11:00 in the morning on this day October 31, 2023.

Here are my notes written after the meeting when back in the office as follows:

- Billie answered her door and led Paul and myself to an outbuilding separate from her house saying something similar to, "my house is such a mess" and invited us both to sit and talk in the outbuilding (we did).
- It appeared as though Billie had been crying due to her red face and tears on her face but she was smiling and being gracious in her movements.
- The dog was very happy and was smelling us and getting lots of rubs and affection.
- I noticed that Billy's hand was still bandaged.
- Billie immediately recognized Paul as being "the nice one" and provided that Paul was the officer who gave cookies to her dog in the past.
- Paul provided Billie with his title as well as my information; I provided Billie with my card. They discussed previous Animal Control Officers in the area.
- Paul continued the conversation and updated Billie that one dog has been declared 'Dangerous' as per provincial legislation (Community Charter) and they working towards declaring the second dog.
- Billie interrupted Paul in a loud voice saying something like, "that is not good enough, I want to know where the dogs are at all times, I don't care about the names of the owner, I want to know where the dogs live, why they were not immediately seized like Director Rice said".
- Paul started discussing that staff needs to abide by FOI POP and Billie interrupted again in loud voice something similar to, "that needs to change, I will change the legislation, you need to tell me why the dogs were not immediately seized by law, Director Rice said you could have".

- In an effort to try to reduce Billy's angst, I said something like, "why don't you lead me through the issues so I can hear from you what took place..."
- Billie interrupted while getting out of her couch and screamed out something like, "this is too little too late, I want you out of my property", she quickly moved through the door and outside and up to the entrance to her house continuing screaming things like, "Don't come back, Get out".
- Paul had a shocked look on his face; I was shocked from the screaming coming from Billie.
- We collected our things and left the separate outbuilding and then left the property while making certain that the fence was securely closed at approximately 11:15 am.

Due to my concern over Billy's outbursts, yelling, and recent trauma, I contacted Mental Health at 888-494-3888 when I got back to the office. I was requested to contact Crisis Nurse at 250-286-7159. I advised the nurse that I was concerned for Billy due to recent trauma and her state of mind and was hoping that they could check in. The Nurse listened and advised that Mental Health will reach out to Billie.

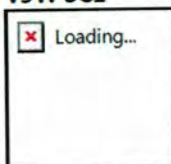

I hit the boxer's back a couple of times and he let go of the spaniel. I stopped hitting the dog as soon as he backed off, but when I stopped, the boxer attacked the spaniel again. I hit the boxer a couple more times and he let go of the spaniel. He then circled around and lunged at the spaniel again, and I shouted "NO!" very loudly and he backed off. The boxer and the shepherd then ran off, down Wavecrest and up Seabreeze. I could see that the woman's hand was badly damaged and bleeding, but I did not see how the injury occurred. The spaniel was shaking and seemed to be bleeding badly. Other neighbors came running out and one administered first aid to the woman. I ran to my house and told my wife to call 911 and see if there was an emergency vet we could call. She did so and then brought out a first aid kit and blanket to try to comfort the woman and keep her and the dog from going into shock. He was GROWLING and trying to drag us with his teeth and strength. This was beyond horrifying. If I did not have a firm grip he would have killed her. After what seemed an eternity, a man, Mr Kepler who was working on his truck houses away came with a tool of some kind and hit the dog many many times before the dog released. This man who is not the sort to hit any living thing saved her very life. Soon will work on recognition for him.

The Keplers stayed with me the entire time. It was Mrs Kepler who called 911. All authorities attended - AC, Ambulance & RCMP. All were more than awesome as were all neighbours providing blankets for Carly & trying to calm me. I will never be calm. I held Carly fast, we were both extremely traumatized. The paramedics even got on the ground treating my hand they knew I could not let go. They took my vitals and checked the wound and truly tried their best to take me in the ambulance to the hospital but we could not find a vet on a Saturday to see her. The punctures were deep and at her lungs. Incredibly, the Keplers offered to take Carly & I all the way to Nanaimo and waited for her surgery & drove us back! I never saw them in my life before. Kerry just shrugged and threw his hands in the air over & over again almost gaining a light, all the while 'it's not my fault, I didn't hear her screaming & the crack house had lots of chance; lots of witnesses saw this. Carly was well cared for in Nanaimo - the paramedics even called while we were there to see if Carly was ok. RCMP officer called next day. When the couple dropped us off I loaded Carly in my car & we went to hospital for my hand. Carly was evaluated for wounds which were received following an altercation with another animal. The following wounds were present:

- left axilla-2 wounds
- right inner thigh
- left neck- 2 wounds

Carly was sedated and their wounds thoroughly cleaned and flushed. The larger wounds were repaired with sutures. These sutures will need to be removed in 14 days. Please schedule a follow up with your primary veterinarian to facilitate this.

The smaller wounds have been left open for now, so that they can drain. There is extensive bruising and some areas of skin may necrose and slough

Animal fight wounds can sometimes become worse before they become better, regardless of whether or not they are sutured/repared – tissue may continue to die off for several days after discharge. In some cases, the visible injuries are far less severe than injuries to deeper tissues or internal organs, leading to the medical nickname of 'tip of the iceberg' injuries. Total healing for severe cases can take 4-8 weeks or longer, and additional surgical procedures are sometimes needed.

As this is an active investigation and given the requirements of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act, information available at this time is limited, but I can advise that the SRD's contractor Coastal Animal Control was on the scene shortly after the incident to begin investigation, take witness statements and gather appropriate written and photo documentation. In addition, the RCMP attended and opened their own file.

Investigations are ongoing, we are applying the Community Charter (s47-s49) and SRD Animal Control Bylaw to determine the best course of action and enforcement tools available.

The Animal Control officer needs to determine if the incident meets the criteria of either a vicious and/or dangerous dog. If this is the case, some enforcement measures may include having to have the dog leashed and muzzled while in public and the issuance of fines. Further measures could include seizure and/or impoundment of the dog.

Any consideration of destruction of a dog would require a Provincial Court Order.

I am unable to confirm the location of the dogs at this time, it is important for us to provide assurance to the public that we are doing the very best we can under the circumstances to ensure the safety of the community.

Any aggressive history related to the dogs is bound by the confidential nature of the current investigation.

Beyond the local governments process and enforcement measures, the owner of the dog could always seek civil damages through the Courts.

SRD DANGEROUS DOG DECLARATION [FILE NO. SD1546] SF. 3 YEAR OLD BRINDLE COLOURED MASTIFF TYPE DOG [MADDIE]

Dear [REDACTED]

As you are aware, on Saturday, October 14, 2023, at approximately 15:19 hours, your dog MADDIE, was involved in an aggressive dog incident at or near the [REDACTED] Campbell River, British Columbia [RCMP File No. 23-14901]. At the above date and time, and while a person was walking their leashed dog along the public roadway, MADDIE, and a German Shepherd owned by an immediate family member of yours, became at large, after aggressively charging onto the roadway from [REDACTED] and without provocation, attacked the dog.

The person held their dog by its collar in attempting to protect it, and although able to kick the German Shepherd off their dog, MADDIE continued attacking and biting, and grabbed the leashed dog by its neck, while biting down on the person's hand. Despite the person screaming for help, MADDIE did not release her grip while mauling and trying to drag the dog and its owner. A nearby resident heard the screams and intervened by hitting MADDIE over the head multiple times with a tool until she let go.

MADDIE inflicted a level 4 dog bite injury to the victim dog, of (4) canine puncture wounds, deep open lacerations, and considerable bruising, which required immediate emergency veterinarian surgery at the Central Island Veterinary Emergency Hospital in Nanaimo. Treatment included, sedation, the implantation of drainage tubes, anti-inflammatory medication, suturing, and prescribed pain medication and antibiotics. Further veterinarian treatment is expected.

The dog's owner also sustained serious dog bite injuries and was treated at the Campbell River North Island General Hospital, where they received thirteen (13) stitches to their hand and were prescribed pain medication and antibiotics. This was a very frightening ordeal, and had a neighbour not intervened, the outcome may have been far worse.

As numerous people, including seniors and children, use this public roadway on a daily basis, and as many dog bite injuries to people occur as a result of a person attempting to intervene and save their dog from an attack, this incident represents a significant public safety hazard and liability concern. As you are now aware that MADDIE has a tendency, or disposition for aggression, MADDIE's exposure to the public must be mitigated, and you may be held civilly liable in BC Provincial Court for third-party personal injury, and property damage claims as a result of MADDIE's actions. Extreme caution must be exercised in MADDIE's further care and control.

Due to this unprovoked attack in a public place, and the serious dog bite injuries inflicted, to both a person, and a domestic animal, this letter is to advise you that under Section 707.1 of the Local Government Act, and Section 49 of the Community Charter, MADDIE is considered a Dangerous Dog in the entirety of British Columbia.

MADDIE IS CONSIDERED A DANGEROUS DOG IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

As this incident is now learned behaviour, and as dogs can become habituated through repeated actions, displays of aggression can escalate in severity and can lead to further attacks and serious dog bite injuries. Once a dog has shown aggression, its movements must be restricted for the safety of all within the community, as aggression cannot be erased from a dog but can be controlled through proper handling and containment.

[Please note the following legislation]

COMMUNITY CHARTER [SBC 2003] CHAPTER 26

DANGEROUS DOG MEANS ANY DOG THAT

- a) has killed or seriously injured a person;
- b) has killed or seriously injured a domestic animal while in a public place or while on private property, other than property owned or occupied by the person responsible for the dog; or
- c) an animal control officer has reasonable grounds to believe is likely to kill or seriously injure a person.

STRATHCONA REGIONAL DISTRICT BYLAW NO. 1073

- a) No person owning or having the custody, care or control of a vicious dog shall suffer, permit or allow it to be upon any street, lane, park or other public place within the District unless such dog is muzzled and led on a leash or chain by some person over the age of 15 years.
- b) The fine for violating the above section is \$150.00.

Under Section (284) of the Local Government Act, and Section (16) of the Community Charter, an Animal Control Officer, Bylaw Enforcement Officer, or Peace Officer, may enter at all reasonable times, upon any property subject to the regulations of these bylaws in order to ascertain whether such regulations or directions are being obeyed.

ANY FURTHER AGGRESSION CONCERNING YOUR DOG COULD RESULT IN

- a) Additional fines being issued; and
- b) Your dog being seized under Section 49 of the Community Charter with an application being made to the Provincial Court for an order that your dog be destroyed.

Public safety is our primary concern and I thank you for your quick response and attention to this most serious of matters. Please do not hesitate to contact Animal Control for further guidance on these regulations and to answer any questions you may have.

By receiving this letter, it is acknowledged that you have been made aware of your dog's actions, have been made aware of what is required of you to be compliant with the Strathcona Regional District Bylaw No. 1073; and fully understand the consequences if any further acts of aggression occur.

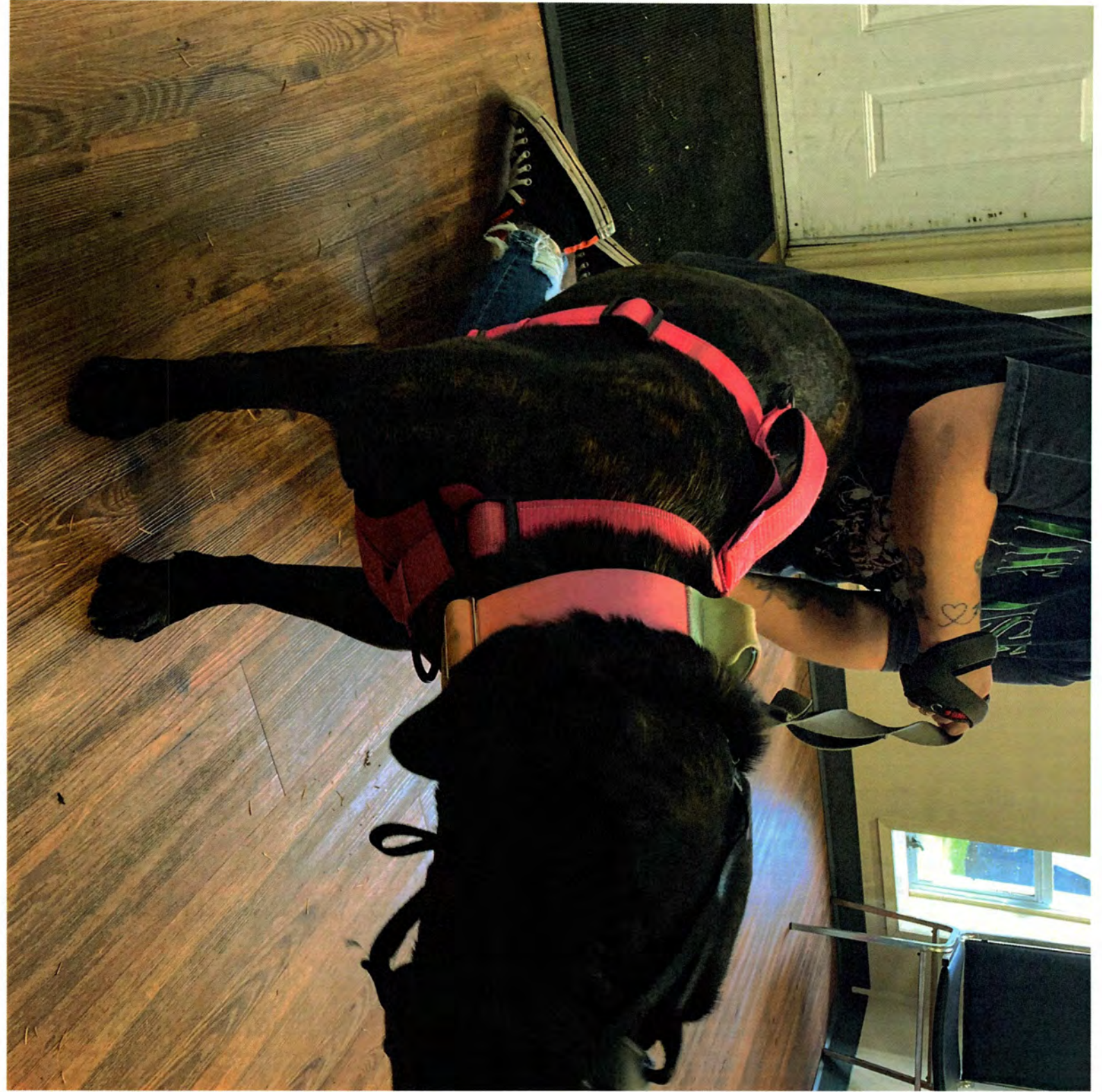
