

BYLAW NO. 612

A BYLAW TO REGULATE ACCESS TO THE ELECTORAL AREA D WOOD DEBRIS REMOVAL SERVICE

WHEREAS the Regional District has, by Bylaw No. 581, established a wood debris removal service for Electoral Area D (Oyster Bay - Buttle Lake);

AND WHEREAS the Strathcona Regional District may, pursuant to s.335 of the Local Government Act, enact regulations in relation to a service;

AND WHEREAS the Regional District wishes to regulate the circumstances under which the wood debris removal service will be available to members of the public;

NOW THEREFORE the Board of Directors of the Strathcona Regional District, in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

Volume of Wood Debris

The Regional District is under no obligation to remove or otherwise process wood debris 1. resulting from industrial, forestry, land clearing or other types of operations that exceeds the volume typically associated with residential occupation of a property.

Location of Wood Debris

Wood debris intended for chipping or removal must be placed adjacent to a public road 2. and be available for processing during the days and hours specified for that purpose by the Regional District.

Authority to Provide Wood Chips

3. The Regional District may, at its sole discretion, make the wood chips or other product generated by the wood debris removal service available to the public for such uses and upon such terms as the Regional District may from time to time determine.

Delegation of Authority

(1) The authority to impose the requirements and limitations described in this bylaw is hereby delegated to the Chief Administrative Officer or a person designated by the Chief Administrative Officer subject to an appeal under s.232 of the Local Government Act. (2) A person wishing to appeal a decision made under the authority delegated by this

bylaw must submit a request in writing to the Regional Board outlining the reconsideration

being requested and the reasons for the request.
